RELEASE OF LIABILITY FOR MINOR PARTICIPANTS READ BEFORE SIGNING

IN CONSIDERATION OF _____, my minor child/ward being allowed to participate in the WOODSTOCK Flag FOOTBALL program, I agree to this release of liability for he/she to participate in any way in the WOODSTOCK YOUTH FOOTBALL. (herein also referred to as the "WYF") program, related events and activities of the WYF. The undersigned acknowledges, appreciates, and agrees that:

1. The risk of injury to my child from the activities involved in these programs is significant, including the potential for permanent disability and death, and while particular rules, equipment and personal discipline may reduce this risk, the risk of injury does exist; and,

2. FOR MYSELF, SPOUSE, AND CHILD, I KNOWINGLY AND FREELY ASSUME ALL SUCH RISKS, BOTH KNOWN AND UNKNOWN, EVEN IF ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASEES OR OTHERS, AND ASSUME FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR MY CHILD, and,

3. I willingly agree to comply with the program participation. If I observe any unusual significant concern in my child, in the program itself, I will remove my child from participation and bring such to the attention of the nearest official immediately; and,

4. I, for myself, my spouse, my child and on behalf of my heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, HEREBY RELEASE WOODSTOCK Youth Football. Program, its directors, officers, volunteers, and other participants, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, advertisers, and, if applicable, owners and lessors of premises used to conduct the event (herein collectively referred to herein as the "Released Parties") from any and all liability whatsoever, WITH RESPECT TO ANY AND ALL INJURY, DISABILITY, DEATH OR OTHER DETRIMENTAL EVENT ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE AND/OR WILFUL ACTS OF THE RELEASED PARTIES OR OTHERWISE, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

5. I, for myself, my spouse, my child and on behalf of my heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, HEREBY INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS all the above Released Parties from any and all liabilities incident to my or my child's/ward's involvement or participation in these programs, EVEN ARISING FROM THEIR NEGLIGENCE OR WILFUL ACTS, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

Woodstock Flag Football Parent and Participant Code of Conduct for 2010

This Code of Conduct was developed to insure an environment that encourages good behavior, fair play, respect, and fun. WOODSTOCK FLAG FOOTBALL organization requires all parents and participants to support and actively practice this Code of Conduct. Under this Code of Conduct, Parents and Participants shall:

- 1. Play Fair.** Fair play means respect. Winning is without value if victory has been achieved unfairly or dishonestly. Cheating is easy, but brings no pleasure in the game. Playing fair requires courage and character. It is always more satisfying. Fair play always has its rewards, even when the game is lost. Playing fair earns you respect, while cheaters are detested. Remember: it is only a game, and games are pointless unless played fairly.
- 2. Observe the Rules of the Game.** All games need rules to guide them. Without rules, there would be chaos. The rules of football are simple and easy to learn. Make an effort to learn them, so you understand the game better. They are designed to make the game fun to play and fun to watch.
- 3. Respect Opponents, Teammates, Game Officials, Volunteer Coaches, Board Members, and Spectators.** These people have the same rights as you, including the right to be respected, and are also a part of the game. Without opponents, there can be no game. Do not criticize players, an opposing team or its players, coaches, cheerleaders, or fans by word of mouth or by gesture, but reserve constructive criticism for later, in private. Spectators give the game atmosphere. They want to see the game played fairly, but must also behave fairly themselves. As a parent, I agree to not go on the playing field, to not criticize officials, coaches, players or opposing players, and I agree to not make any physical touching of any opposing team members or Thunder team members.
- 4. Not Criticize Game Officials.** Game officials are there to maintain discipline and fair play. Accept decisions made by game officials as being fair and made to the best of their ability. Players and coaches must accept responsibility for their own actions and behavior.
- 5. Play to Win.** Winning is the object of the game. Never set out to lose. If you do not play to win, you are cheating your opponents, deceiving those who are watching, and fooling yourself. Never give up against stronger opponents, but never relent against weaker ones. It is an insult to any opponent to play at less than full effort. Play to win until the final whistle.
- 6. Accept Defeat with Dignity.** Nobody wins all the time. You win some, and you lose some. Learn to lose graciously. Don't seek excuses for defeat; genuine reasons will always be self-evident. Congratulate the winners with good grace. Don't blame the game officials or anyone else. Decide to do and be better next time.
- 7. Observe the Rules and Restrictions of the Locations at which we play.** Please refrain from the use of tobacco, alcohol, or illegal substances, at all Woodstock games and practices. Avoid those things that impair your ability to make good judgments in the things that you do.
